

**1. Copy each combatant's name from the Registration form. This is usually done by rank.**

(Kingdom Laws, Article V, A.) The Order of Precedence in An Tir is

- Sovereign and Consort
- Crown Prince and Crown Princess
- Territorial Princes and Princesses
- Tanists and Tanistas to Territorial Principalities
- Kingdom Champions
- Holder of the Lion of An Tir
- Dukes and Duchesses
- Counts and Countesses
- Viscounts and Viscountesses
- Territorial Barons and Baronesses
- Members of the Orders of the Chivalry, Laurel and Pelican
- Members of the Orders of the Hasta Leonis, White Scarf, Gray Goose Shaft, Jambe de Lion, Goutte de Sang,
- Holder of a Grant of Arms
- Former Founding and Landed Barons and Baronesses
- Barons and Baronesses of the Court
- Holder of an Award of Arms

NOTE: **Only** combat ranks are used while on the tourney field. Thus, Laurels and Pelicans, Jambes and Gouttes, and AoAs are not used. However, a participant who is a member of the Order of the White Scarf and is also a Laurel or Pelican would come before an OWS who is not. For participants not covered by the OP above the following is a guideline for placement in the Lists:

- Baronial champions
- Sergeants/Yeoman/Gallants
- Squires/Cadets/Arcuarii
- All remaining participants.

**2. Pairings are commonly made by pairing the top half of the participants with the bottom half.**

Example: Double-Elim Round 1 -- 12 combatants = 1:12, 2:11, 3:10, 4:9, 5:8, 6:7

Double-Elim Round 2 -- 12 combatants = 1:11, 2:12, 3:9, 4:10, 5:7, 6:8

**3. The opponent's number is then written in the small upper box. The win or loss ("W" or "L") is recorded in the lower portion after the marshals have confirmed the victor. The opponent's number and the W/L can be written in the opposite boxes, so long as the entire sheet is consistent.**

**4. If the tourney is double-elim, once a combatant has received two losses, they are removed from the next round of pairings. Using a highlighter through the rest of their entry can help as a reminder to not include them, and allows results to still be recorded if an error has been made.**

Single, or triple-elimination are performed the same as above. Once a combatant has received the specified number of losses they are removed from further pairings.
